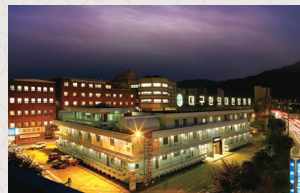

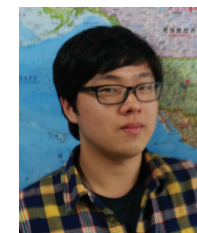

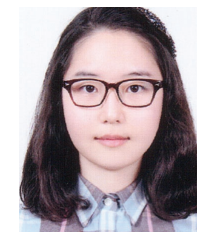

What to do & Where to go

1) Korean Culture Activity (Hands-On Experience Program)



① Experience in Traditional Korean Houses (Han-ok)

• A traditional Korean house is called 'Hanok'. Hanok sought to create a living space based on the coexistence of nature and humans. Accordingly, the natural aspects of traditional Korean houses range from the structure's inner layout to the building materials which were used. Another unique feature of traditional houses is their special design for cooling the interior ('daecheong') in the summer and heating the interior ('ondol gudeul') in the winter.

② Traditional Korean Clothing (Hanbok)

• The hanbok has been the Korean people's unique traditional costume for thousands of years. Before the arrival of Western-style clothing one hundred years ago, the hanbok was everyday attire Today, the hanbok is worn on days of celebration such as weddings, Seollal (Lunar New Year's Day) or Chuseok (Korean Thanksgiving Day).



③ Korean Tea Ceremony('Dado') and Etiquette, Traditional Pressed Sweets('Dasik')

• Individual tea ceremony('dado') table (hands-on experience of how to brew and drink tea), and a comparison of the tea ceremonies of Korea, China and Japan.
 • Learn how to bow and how to wear traditional Korean clothes('hanbok') and accessories.

④ Eco Bag Making · Trying Korea Tradition doctor's Costumes

• On the white cloth bag, stencil a medicinal herbal flower
 • Try on doctor's costumes just like the ones Huh Joon and Dae Jang Geum wore on TV

⑤ Making oriental natural air freshener

• Use 7 fragrant herbal ingredients to make an oriental natural air freshener
 • Traditional medicine packing procedure using 7 fragrant ingredients
 • It works for eradicating harmful insects and allergic, getting rid of odor

⑥ Making Folk painting Fan ('Bu-cha')

• Drawing some Korean traditional folk paintings on the white fan
 • Waving the fan will help you feel cool



⑦ Smulnori (traditional percussion quartet)

• Learning the rhythm of Traditional Korean Music
 • 4 musical instrument ; Jang-gu, Jing, Buk, Kkwaenggwari

2) Learning

① Korean Language Course (I , II)

- Teaching staffs of the center are qualified Korean language specialists who are professionally trained, and experienced in teaching Korean to the students of other languages
- Learning simple Korean expressions



② Participating in Herbal Skin Care Practical course

- Introducing Herbal Skin Care
: Teaching wide area of industrial knowledge like, skin and hair care, nail care, make-up and herbal skin care
- Have a chance to get makeup, special makeup, hair styling, nail care with DHU students

Practical training contents

- Nail art
 - ▶ Material: nipper, pusher, cuticle oil, base-coat, polish, top-coat
 - Training: Base care and coloring
- Make-up
 - ▶ Material: aqua color, brush, star powder
 - Training: Demonstration of the fantasy make-up
 - ▶ Material: Meridian Scraping, aroma oil
 - Training: Body massage using Meridian Scraping and aroma oil
- Making natural soap
 - ▶ Material: soap base, mold, essential oil, glycerine.
 - Training: Making MP soap



③ Participating in Cosmeceutical Science Practical course

- Intro of Cosmeceutical Science
: 4year degree academic and practical knowledge to the students to be able to become prepared in the developing and studying cosmetic.
- make your own cosmetic and learn the effect of herbal medicine materials

Practical training contents

- Making Herbal cosmetic
 - ▶ Materials: cosmetic base, mold, essential oil, glycerine.
 - ▶ Training: following the instruction, making you own cosmetic



3) Excursion

① Pohang Homigot Beach

- Homigot is located in the easternmost area of the Korean Peninsula. Its name origins from its geographic feature which resembles tail of a tiger, an animal that many Korean believes that the peninsula resembles.
- Homigot was selected as one of the ten best place to see sunrise by the Korean Tourism Organization



② POSCO (Pohang Iron and Steel Compy)

- POSCO was established in 1968. It has two steel mills in Pohang and Gwangyang. The main product ranges from hot rolling, cold strip, steel plate, wire rod and blooms. In the period of 1970 to 1973, POSCO has built Pohang Steel Mill with the capacity of 1.03 million ton which is quipped with 4 furnaces.
- In 1994 POSCO was listed in New York Stock Exchange and in the following year it was listed in London Stock Exchange. By 1997 it has introduced external board of trustee system to make the company's operation more transparent. In 2000, after Development Bank sold its entire shares of POSCO, the company was privatized. In 2001 it started regional heating business, and in 2002 it included conveying, processing and selling minerals in both domestic and overseas market as a new business objective.



③ Daegu Bangjja Yugi Museum

- Bangjja is vessel made by pounding melted brass. Bangjja Yugi Museum is the nation's only brassware specialized museum. Quality brassware made by brassware specialist Lee Bong-ju on display.



- Bangjja Yugi(Korean Bronzeware) is made by a method wherein an alloy of copper and tin, in the ratio of 78 parts to 22, is pounded and hit repeatedly by several people with hammers in hand to draw it out thinly to form a shape. Major items of Bangjja Yugi include musical instruments, utensils and other items for religious rituals, tableware and living goods.



④ Donghwasa Temple

- You can appreciate various Buddhist cultures, such as zen meditation, tea ceremony and the Temple Stay program at Donghwasa Temple. The place has long history since its establishment by Buddhist Monk Geukdalhwasang in 495. There are also International Zen Meditation and Training Center.



⑤ Yangnyeongsi Museum of Oriental Medicine

- The Yangnyeongsi Museum of Oriental Medicine is a cultural space that features herbal medicinal items. It exhibits the 400 year-long history of the Yangnyeongsi Oriental Herb Medicine Market. It also provide various programs including well-bing program. Herbal medicine shops, oriental medicine clinics, and herb wholesalers are clustered in the area where the museum is located.

⑥ Daegu Modern Cultural Alley

- Medical Missions Museum:** This place with 100years of history were previously used for western missionaries' residence in early 1900s. Currently the place is opened to public as museum which demonstrates history of Catholic mission through medical and educational activities.
- Gyesan Catholic Church:** Since its establishment in 1899, the church has been the symbol of Catholic settlement in Daegu. It is now registered as cultural heritage.
- Jaeil Protestant Church:** This historical church is the first protestant church in Daegu.
- Old Residence of Lee Sang-hwa:** Poet Lee Sang-hwa spent the rest of his life in this house. This Daegu-born and famed poet in modern history of Korea's well-known works can be found in this house.

⑦ Dongseongro Street

- Filled with young spirit throughout the whole year, Dongseongro is the busiest shopping street in Daegu and has become the symbol of the city. Along the street, there are department store, in which we will cook some traditional Korean food, shopping malls and many brand shops for garments and sports goods. Cultural spaces, bookstores, movie theaters, and performance halls are also lined up along the street.
- From 15th May, Dongseongro Festival is held and we will visit the street during the festival.



4) Facilities

① First in the Nation, DHU Cosmetic Factory.

- "Kirin Herb Tech", established at DHU Samseong Campus on May 2005, leads herbal industry in the region. It focuses DHU as a specialized institute, while creating employment opportunities and promoting economic development in local area.

② "Hanhak-Chon", where Culture is not only Experienced but also Taught.

- Located in Samseong Campus, Hanhak-Chon is becoming a favourite spot for many international visitors to DHU. Special sessions including tea ceremony, education for traditional customs and manners, and culture program are held in this beautiful place. It also attracts local people with its fantastic view of Gyeongsan city from the building.4) Facilities

③ School-owned Tourist Agency that Specializes in Medical and Cultural Tourism

- DHU Toursit agency has been established since October 2011. While providing medical and cultural tour service that features Gyeongju, an old capital of Kingdom of Silla, Andong, a remarkable place where Confucianism in Korea has been grown, and medical tourism that is provided cooperatively with DHU herbal medical institute, DHU also provides a place for on-sight learning to its students.

④ "Kirin Gym", where Healthy Mind is Cultivated through Healthy Body

- Kirin Gym is an open place for DHU students where visitors can easily get access to various facilities after booking. Students can use squash court and golf range for free of cost, including the weight training area. Within the Gym, students can also receive free medical service at the Health Care Center, which provides acupuncture treatment and general medical care.
